Geneva, Switzerland, 20 January 2012 – With more than one-quarter of all participants at this year's World Economic Forum Annual Meeting active on Twitter, new media is the strongest platform to follow all the news, views and daily happenings in Davos live online.

Watch out for the pulses starting Wednesday 25 January. Pulse results will feed directly into sessions, with public opinion helping to shape the agenda of this year's Annual Meeting.
